Jurisdictions Adopting Emergency or Local Emergencies to Contain the Spread of COVID-19

Following Mayor Romero's lead, the Pima County Board of Supervisors, Oro Valley's Mayor Winfield and Marana's Mayor Honea have all declared emergencies which went into effect at 8:00 p.m. last night (March 19). The City of Tucson's emergency began at 8:00 p.m. on March 17. The emergency declarations mandate the following:

Orders all bars, gyms, theaters, cinemas, gyms and similar places of public gathering to close, and will prohibit all restaurants from being open for on-site consumption. The resolutions allow the use of restaurant delivery service, curbside-service, or drive-through service, and to use other appropriate precautions so as to mitigate the potential transmission of COVID-19.

Sahuarita's Mayor Murphy also declared an emergency on March 17 but his declaration does not mandate the closure of establishments. His proclamation asks places of public gatherings of more than 10 to "implement social distancing."
